### **VERBS / TENSES**

Simple Past tense: regular and irregular verbs (affirmative, interrogative and negative)

There was / there were

Obligation and prohibition: must - mustn't

Going to: future intention (all persons and forms: affirmative, interrogative and negative)

Can: permission (all forms: affirmative, interrogative and negative)

Have to/not have to simple present

### **STRUCTURES**

Prepositions of location: under, next to, on the left/right, between, in front of, in, on, behind, above

Prepositions of direction: along, left, right, out of, into, over, on, off, under, past.

(Examples: go along the street, turn right, go into/out of a building, get on/off the bus, go under a bridge, go past a building)

Means of transport: by car, plane, bus- on foot. How?

Frequency adverbs: always, usually, often, sometimes, rarely, never. How often?

Quantifiers: many, much, a lot (of). How much/many?

Sequence markers: first, then, after that, next, finally.

Infinitive of purpose. What for? Why?

How questions: how far/wide/high/deep/long/old
